#### **REMOTE TRIAL EXAMS**

These are trying times indeed and we are finding that we need to make adjustments as we go to help you keep moving forward in your educational journey. We still have to assume that the HSC may happen in its original form, so we want to help you prepare for it as best we can under the current circumstances in which we find ourselves. We also want you to have an opportunity to demonstrate what you have learned up to this point. With that in mind we are doing a modified version of the Trial Exams remotely.

# **Key Information**

- Exams will begin on Tuesday 17th August
- Exams will be done at home under timed conditions
- Exams will be handwritten
- Exams will be 'open book'
- Teachers have modified the exams to suit this setting. Most exams have been shortened and they will focus on questions that require application of your knowledge
- Because of the change in nature of the task and setting, the exam weighting will be reduced by 10%. Those marks will be distributed evenly across your other 3 Assessment Tasks
- Classes will not be running during the exam period

#### **Exam Process**

- Please follow the **Timetable** (see page 3) closely so you ensure you are ready for each exam
- Your teacher will run a **Zoom session** during the exam. This link will be sent to you via your Google Classroom no later than ten minutes before the start of the exam
- You don't need to have your camera on. Teachers will prompt you when to start preparing, start and stop writing and when to begin uploading your responses. They are also there for help if you need
- Your exams will be **posted to your Google Classrooms** along with a copy of a writing booklet at 9:00am
- You will be given ten minutes to prepare to do the paper. You're welcome to print the
  paper or read it off the screen. You will then have 20 minutes at the end of the exam to
  scan and upload the documents onto your Google Classroom

# To prepare for the exams

- Use the new Study Guides sent out by your teachers to revise effectively for the exams
- Ensure you have a suitable place that is tidy and quiet to complete the exams
- The exams will be hand written so you need to have loose leaf paper available. If you'd
  prefer, you could print off a Writing Booklet (see your GC page) or pick some up from the
  College before the exam period begins
- Ensure you have the equipment you need
  - Pen
  - Paper
  - Device (fully charged)
  - Phone/device to scan and upload final responses

## Completing the exams

- Have your Zoom session on so that you can follow the instructions from the teacher. Use the chat function if you have a question
- Take time to read through all of the questions carefully and plan your work before you begin
- Do your own work. Even though it is 'open book', you must write in your own words or ensure you reference authors if you quote directly from their work. Your submissions should follow the guidelines set out in the NESA- All my own Work documents
- Label each section clearly on your writing paper, and clearly number each page you use

### Illness/Misadventure Process

  to the best of your ability, please fill out an Appeal Form (see your GC page). There will also
  be a copy available in your Google Classroom
